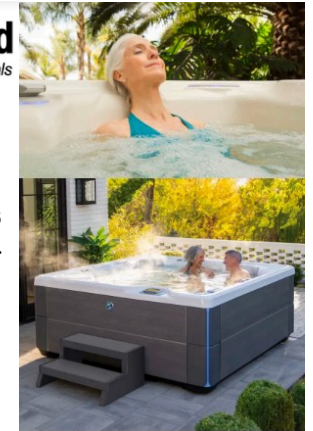

Curate's Page

Over the last few weeks I have enjoyed watching Race Across the World. The series followed five teams as they made the journey from the Great Wall of China to the southernmost tip of India. As they travelled from one checkpoint to the next the task was often gruelling; flights, smartphones, credit cards and contact with loved ones at home were forbidden and they had to learn to survive on a very tight budget.



Important choices were needed at every step; from choosing the route, deciding when to work to increase the budget and balancing which mode of transport would be cost effective. Contestants were constantly torn between their desire for unforgettable experiences and their determination to win the race. Of course there were tensions, disagreements, disappointments and self-discovery along the way. We got to see their mistakes, their levels of endurance and how they changed as people. We were shown amazing scenery and saw what life is like in a different culture.

Perhaps if you watched the show you wondered what it would be like to be a contestant. What parts would you find challenging? Who would you choose to travel with? Would the highs make up for the lows? How competitive would you be?

The Bible uses the imagery of a race in various contexts to give valuable insight into the Christian journey. It highlights the importance of perseverance, being cheered on by others, keeping our focus and much more. There is a verse which says, 'So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air.' In other words; 'I'm living my life with purpose.' That has been my experience; following Jesus is the most exhilarating, meaningful and rewarding race you could ever be part of.

As explained in our last news article we are changing our clinical IT system for Emis to TPP SystmOne in July 2025, and we want to explain why we are doing this and what impact this will have on the service we provide to you.

What is TPP SystmOne?

It is a clinical record system used to record patient care electronically (your health records).

Why are you changing systems?

We have made the decision to change as we feel that SystmOne is a more reliable system. Some of our staff have used SystmOne in previous settings and found it to have better features and functionality than EMIS.

When is the changeover taking place?

From the 9th – 17th July inclusive.

What will happen to my prescription requests during the period of changeover?

To help staff manage the changeover we ask that prescription requests due during the period of changeover are submitted by 27th June. We will be able to operate a normal service again from 18th July.

Our 'live' date for the new system is Friday 18th July and we will have full access to our new appointment diary from this date onwards. With any change in digital systems, we expect to have "teething" issues, so we are asking our patients to please bear with us and please be patient while we settle into our new system particular in the days following our changeover.

Will my NHS App/Patient Access login still work?

The NHS app/NHS desktop login works for both Emis and SystmOne and will continue to work.

Patient Access is a system that only works with EMIS. As we are no longer using EMIS you will **NO LONGER** have access to Patient Access from the 7th July. We are recommending that patients either download the NHS app (on mobile or tablets, available via your Appstore) or access the NHS desktop login here: www.nhsapp.service.nhs.uk/login

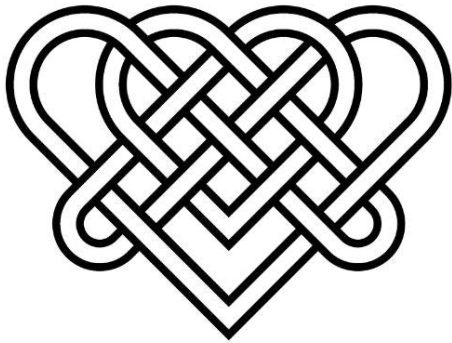
Her funeral service was held on 20th June at St Mary's Church, Yelverton.

Holistic Wellness with Mel – Seasonal self Care ideas

Hello again, Melanie Purdy here, Holistic Therapist (Reflexology etc) in Newton Flotman.

During my training for Menopause Reflexology we were told that putting something cold on the Reflexology point of the Hypothalamus would halt a hot flush. The function of the Hypothalamus is to help produce hormones that regulate body temperature, appetite, heart rate and sleep cycles, amongst other things.

The Hypothalamus point for Facial Reflexology is in the centre of the forehead. I was with my friend once while a hot flush began for her and remembering this I suggested she put something cold on her forehead. She had an empty glass nearby and rolled that across her forehead, her hot flush stopped. It was brilliant to witness. Ideas of cold things to use include the back of a metal spoon or a cold smooth stone or crystal. I've been pondering whether this trick would also work to cool us down during this hot weather.

I've come across something else called a cooling towel or ice towel. It's a very thin microfibre scarf/towel that you make wet, wring out and hang around your neck. When it becomes warm again you give it a flicky snappy shake (it's hard to describe) and it magically goes very cold again. Clever.

Remember to stay hydrated in this heat. The NHS recommended daily intake of fluid for most people is 1.5 - 2 litres. They recommend that water is best but that lower fat milk and tea and coffee can also count.

Symptoms of dehydration can include feeling thirsty, dark yellow/strong smelling urine, urinating less often than usual, feeling dizzy and lightheaded, feeling tired, a dry mouth, lips and tongue and sunken eyes.

Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group - Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan update



Since my last article about the Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan in March 2025 at which time I noted that the plan had to go through six stages before it was adopted, I am pleased to report that the plan has completed stages 1 – 3.

Stage 3 consisted of South Norfolk District Council commissioning an independent examiner to undertake an examination of the plan.

The Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan has been examined by the appointed independent examiner who has identified some change to the plan which the Steering Group will undertake in the next month and then submit to South Norfolk District Council.

At the end of his report, the independent examiner had the following comment to make about the neighbourhood plan:

'It is clear that the Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan is the product of much hard work undertaken since 2023 by the Parish Council, its Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group and the many individuals and stakeholders who have contributed to the preparation and development of the Plan. In comparison to many neighbourhood plans I have examined, the relatively short timeframe for its production is particularly notable and I commend all those involved in getting the Plan to this advanced stage at such pace. In my assessment, the Plan reflects the land use aspirations and objectives of the Newton Flotman community for the future planning of their Parish up to 2038. The output is a Plan which should help guide the area's development over that period, making a positive contribution to informing decision-making on planning applications by South Norfolk Council.'

The next stage of the process is for South Norfolk District Council to make decisions on the examiner's recommendations and decide on whether to proceed to referendum. Given the independent examiner's comments above we are hopeful that the recommendations will be approved and the District Council will decide to proceed to hold a referendum.

I will keep you informed of any developments.

Newton Flotman Parish Council Notes

Flordon Road

The letter below has been delivered to residents who live on Flordon Road from Dell Close towards Flordon. As stated in the letter, if the situation changes the Parish Council will make contact with Highways.

“Dear Residents

Path along Flordon Road from Dell Close to south west end of the Village

I am writing to update you on the actions the Parish Council have taken to try and get a trod path installed on Flordon Road between Dell Close and the south west end of the village.

A trod path like the one installed in Flordon has been on the Parish Council's agenda for at least six years if not longer. Over this period of time, we have had three meetings with Adam Mayo Highway Engineer South (S2) at Norfolk County Council, Highways & Waste, Community & Environment Services to discuss with him the possibility of installing a path. Each time Adam has told us that:

‘A path would require a crossing point on the bend near to Dell Close. There has not been any accident reported incidents in the last six years on Flordon Road so the work to install a trod path would not qualify as a safety driven scheme. There is insufficient land on parts of the route to insert a trod path.’

Highways have informed the Parish Council that it is not physically possible or feasible to create a trod path on Flordon Road. We have had to reluctantly accept this advice from Highways.

After the last meeting we had with Adam Mayo about this matter it was agreed to install the road markings and gates that are located on the bend beside the cottages at the south-west end of the village.

Please accept our apologies that we have not been able to persuade Highways to provide us with a trod path. We intend to keep monitoring the situation and, should the occasion arise, where the circumstances are favourable towards installing a trod path, we will be banging the door down at Highways on your behalf.”

Dog waste bins

At the time of writing a new dog waste bin is being installed on Greenways. Along with the other 10 dog waste bins in the village residents are encouraged to bag and bin their dog waste and use these bins to dispose of it.
