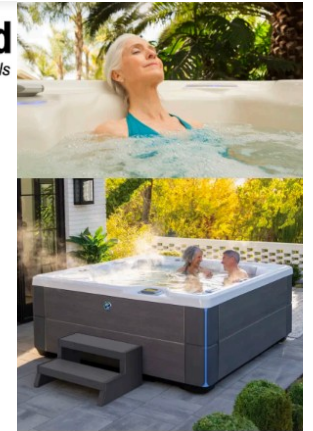

Well, here we are: summer holidays a distant memory; we're well and truly back to school, university and work. Newton Flotman Climate Care Keep Your Garden Birds Healthy

Greenfinches are in serious trouble, but together we can help by keeping feeding stations clean to stop disease spreading. This beautiful little bird was a common sight in gardens but has seen a dramatic decline of 63% since 1993. It has now been moved from the Birds of Conservation Concern's green list to the red list. One of the reasons for the decline is because of a severe outbreak of the disease **trichomonosis**, which can be spread by contaminated food and drinking water. By keeping our feeders and bird baths clean, we can help bring this colourful little character back to our gardens, as well as helping to keep our other garden birds, fit, healthy and disease free. Here's how!



Clean your bird feeders
Wear gloves and empty any old food from the feeders into a bin - **Do not reuse the food or compost it**. If possible, **take the feeders apart** to make them easier to clean. With hot soapy water and a brush, **scrub and clean the feeders**, removing any old food or residue. **Rinse thoroughly** with cold water, preferably outside. **Let it dry completely**, again ideally outside. **Spray with the disinfectant**, following the instructions. **Rinse again** and then let it dry out once more before refilling.

Clean your bird feeders

Cleaning feeders should be done at least every few weeks, but ideally once a week if possible, and it shouldn't take more than 15 minutes. The RSPB recommends using an animal safe disinfectant but a weak solution of domestic bleach can be used as an alternative. Cleaning bird baths and any space where birds congregate will help them stay healthy. Ideally, clean water should be provided every day.

What else can you do? Don't overfill feeders – try and make sure they are being emptied every few days. If possible, set up several different feeding stations to reduce the number of birds in one place. Move your feeders, to prevent the build up of bird food and droppings potentially contaminating the ground below. Avoid putting feeders under where birds roost, such as under trees, to avoid droppings. If possible clean away any old food or droppings from beneath feeders too.

**Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group -
Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan Referendum Result**

The Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan referendum was held on 4th September, and resulted in a positive yes vote to the question:

'Do you want South Norfolk Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Newton Flotman to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The result was 169 yes votes (92.3%) and 14 no votes (7.7%).

The Parish Council and Newton Flotman Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group would like to thank everybody who participated in this referendum.

I have been informed by Richard Squires, Senior Community Planning Officer at South Norfolk and Broadland District Councils that the Neighbourhood Plan now forms part of the statutory development plan for the district. Richard has circulated it to the council's planning officers for use in helping to determine any future applications within the Newton Flotman parish.

Newton Flotman Parish Council Notes

Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) in Norfolk

The Government is reorganising two-tier areas in England (e.g. areas which have both a County Council and a District Council) to create more efficient and streamlined structures in the form of new Unitary Councils. Unitary Councils are a single tier of local government responsible for all local services in an area.

For Norfolk, this means fewer and larger Unitary Councils compared to the current two-tier model which has a total of eight local councils covering the county. The exact number and shape and size of any new Unitary Councils for Norfolk is to be determined. All Councils in Norfolk have been asked to submit reorganisation proposals to Government by 26 September 2025.

David was born on New Years Eve 1942 and attended CNS (City of Norwich School) where he was in the same class as David Segans (died 8th December 2024) who lived in Flordon Road, Newton Flotman.

David joined Norwich Union where he rose to the position of Organisation and Methods Manager before retiring at the age of 50.

David met his wife Sandra in the early 60s and they married in 1967. They moved to Dell Close Newton Flotman in 1972 where they were the first residents in the close, which at the time was surrounded by farm land.

David and Sandra regularly enjoyed holidaying abroad and visited many countries in the far east and Africa.

Left Over Pumpkin Ideas

When you carve out your pumpkins for Halloween, what do you do with the flesh? Do you bin it? Compost it? Rather than wasting it, why not eat it? Here are a couple of ideas which might make you change your mind about pumpkin wastage.

Roasted Pumpkin Seeds: the seeds of a pumpkin make a tasty and healthy snack. Wash the seeds thoroughly and remove any stringy bits of pumpkin flesh. Dry well using kitchen paper. Put the seeds on a baking tray and toss with the olive oil. Roast for 10 mins in the oven 200C/180C fan/gas 6 or roast in an air fryer. For a savoury finish season with salt and pepper, or for sweet sprinkle with a pinch of caster sugar, or drizzle with maple syrup when still hot.

Hearty Pumpkin Soup: You need to have this delightfully warming pumpkin soup recipe on hand when autumn rolls around and there are pumpkins aplenty. It works just as well with dense orange squashes like butternut. Serve with a swirl of cream and some toasted seeds from the pumpkin.

Ingredients:

1 large onion, chopped
2 carrots, peeled and chopped
2 garlic cloves
1 bay leaf
25g/1oz unsalted butter
2 tbsp olive oil
1 medium pumpkin (prepared weight about 850g/1lb 14oz) deseeded and roughly chopped
1 medium-sized floury potato, such as Maris Piper, roughly chopped
1 litre/1¾ pint vegetable or chicken stock, a little extra may be needed
100ml/3½ fl oz double cream
3 tbsp pumpkin seeds
salt and freshly ground black pepper

Method

- Put the onion, carrots, garlic, bay leaf, butter and half the olive oil into a large pan. Cook over a low-medium heat for about 10 minutes until the vegetables are tender but not coloured.
- Add the pumpkin and potato, mix to combine and cook for a further 2-3 minutes. Pour in the stock, season with salt and pepper and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat to a gentle simmer, half cover the pan with a lid

and continue to cook for about 40 minutes until the squash is really tender when tested with the point of a knife.

- Pick out the bay leaf and blend the soup until smooth using a stick blender.
- Add the cream and a little more stock if the soup is on the thick side, taste for seasoning, adding more salt and pepper as required.
- Meanwhile, heat the remaining tablespoon of oil in a frying pan over a medium heat. Add the pumpkin seeds and fry quickly until the seeds start to pop. Remove from the pan.
- Ladle the soup into bowls and serve with a swirl of cream and the toasted pumpkin seeds.

Wildlife Back Garden

A few weeks ago, I got in touch with our local bat group to find out if any bats were nesting amongst the ivy that is attached to my bungalow. I was told that they will only use oak trees that are covered with ivy for extra warmth and protection, or even a dead standing tree, that also has ivy growing over it.

It was suggested that a bat detector would be installed on one of my raised flower beds. The detector was left in place for a week.

I have often seen what I thought was common pipistrelles flying through, and above, the wildflower meadow at the front of my bungalow, catching flying insects or grasping hold of spiders out of their webs. The Woodland Trust has some fabulous video footage of this happening - worth viewing if you're interested in bats.

The good news I have to share is that there were eight different species recorded on the bat detector! There were the usual *common* and *soprano pipistrelles*, and *noctules* nearly always recorded. But the detector also picked up a *barbastelle* - rare, elusive and very hardly seen. There was also an occasional *serotine* and *natterer*, and *brown long eared* bats. Not bad for one week!

How lucky we are to have bats in our village. Bats are unique, mysterious creatures, glimpsed at dusk darting through the night sky as they hunt for insects. There are 18 species of bats living in the UK, 17 of which are known to breed here in Norfolk. Our smallest bat is the *pipistrelle*, weighing between 4 -7g with a wingspan of 18-25cm. Our largest bat is the *noctule* which can weigh up to 40g with a wingspan of between 33-45cm.

All bats have very big appetite because flying uses up lots of energy. A common *pipistrelle* can eat over 3000 tiny insect in a single night! You can help provide food for bats by planting a wildlife-friendly garden. Bats do not make nests, but choose various places throughout the year to roost often with other bats. Some prefer hollow trees, others caves, some use both at different times many shelter in buildings, behind hanging tiles and boarding or in roof spaces.

Bats are clean and sociable animals and spend many hours grooming themselves. Bats are not blind, but at night they use echo location which gives them information about anything that is ahead of them, including the size and shape of an insect and which way it is going. Most of these calls are too high-pitched for humans to hear, but they can be heard with the bat detectors. Each species of bat has a unique frequency of call, making it possible to distinguish species via the detectors.

Sadly our UK bat populations have declined dramatically during the past century. Many of the roosting sites and feeding grounds have been destroyed to make way for buildings, roads or other changes in land use. Pesticides have not only killed many of their insect prey, but also some of the bats themselves. British bats and their roosts are now protected by law. It is illegal to harm, disturb or deliberately alter their roost sites without first seeking advice. The bat helpline can be reached on 03451 300228.
